6.1 Consent Agenda

6.2 Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

The Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services (a.k.a. Back-to-School) plan is required to be reviewed and revised, if necessary, every six months through September 30, 2024. The plan, and each time it is reviewed and revised, must include a process for gathering meaningful stakeholder input and public comment. The checklist does not need to be updated every six months, but should be used as a guide for the Safe Return plan. The LEA's Back-to-School plan AND the checklist are required to be posted on the LEA's website for the duration of the ARP ESSER grant.

6.3 Policies for First Read -

First Read-9550 Cybersecurity & Data Breach Response Policy

This policy provides guidance on recommended cybersecurity standards and addresses broad strategies for preventing data breaches. It includes training requirements recommended by the stakeholders consulted on this policy and provides guidelines for the creation of a plan to address a possible data breach. Finally, it provides guidance on required and recommended reporting of data breaches. This is a new, optional policy.

6.5 School Safety Grant Phase II
